









Movement is a formal device in this home situated on a half acre of waterfront land on the South River. What it means specifically is that pathways inside and outside are designed to manipulate the occupant's vantage point, revealing at different times the land's foreground, middle ground and background. One is exposed continuously to land, water and sky as they move about. As one ascends and descends the stair, a "dynamic experience" is encouraged. Views are framed in ways that reveal unexpected perspectives of the outside as well as upper and lower floors. The home is owned by a local surgeon, Dr. Craig Vander Kolk, who collaborated for five years with the architect, sharing concepts and testing ideas. Brad Lundberg, with precision and finesse, was able to interpret the owner's and architect's program to build this unique wood framed structure with steel back-ups.

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
